## **VOLUNTEERS TO COMPLETE PROVIDENCE PARK WITH LARGEST BUILD YET**

**NASHVILLE, Tenn.** (September 7, 2007) – This weekend Nashville Area Habitat for Humanity will kick off its final – and largest – build to complete Providence Park. Between September 8 and October 21, volunteers will build 15 houses for hard-working, low-income Nashville families, bringing the total number of homes in Providence Park to 138.

The 15-house build will take place over the course of seven weekends, launching four homes September 8, four homes September 15, three homes September 22 and four homes September 29. **Volunteers will begin with first nail ceremonies on Saturday, September 8, at 7:30 a.m.** The entire schedule appears below.

### **About Nashville Area Habitat for Humanity**

NAHFH is a non-profit, ecumenical Christian organization committed to providing families with the life changing opportunity to purchase decent, affordable homes. The agency consistently ranks in the top one percent of all Habitat affiliates and has grown by seven times in size since 2002. NAFHH will build a record 55 homes in 2007 - 40 locally and 15 abroad. As of July 2007, 1106 family members, including 729 children have been served by NAFHH. Prior to becoming homeowners, Habitat partner families must complete up to 475 hours of "sweat equity" at the build site and in the classroom to earn their homes. Mortgage payments at zero percent interest range between \$350 and \$450 per month, including taxes and insurance. NAFHH builds ENERGY STAR Certified energy efficient homes.
