Habitat for Humanity thanks Dickson County

Nashville Area Habitat for Humanity's Dickson Division thanks the community for its generosity and volunteer support, according to a Habitat press release.

"There are so many bighearted people here, and without their help, none of this would be possible," said Chris Greene, development and volunteer

manager, in the press release. "Despite the tough economy, folks here in Dickson have continued to do everything they can to support our ministry and help hardworking families purchase homes of their own."

Since merging with Nashville Area Habitat in July 2007, the Dickson Division has purchased seven lots and built five homes in Dickson. Those five homes put \$6,000 per year in property

tax dollars back into the community, according to the press release.

This year, Dickson Habitat for Humanity raised more funds than in the previous two years combined.

Nashville Area Habitat for Humanity is an ecumenical Christian ministry that provides the opportunity for people to purchase and own quality, affordable homes, according to a statement in the press release.
